Visitors Day Information

- At Manitou there is one family Visiting Day, which falls a few days prior to the end of the first session (see calendar).
- Visiting Day begins at 9:30am (coffee and danish will be served for early arrivers).
- Parents are able to watch their son(s) participate in an activity of choice. There are a number of other presentations and shows put on throughout the morning – including a play.
- The famous Manitou Visitors Day Buffet Lunch will be served to campers and their families.
- After lunch, parents, and campers may choose to stay at camp and participate in selected activities or they may leave camp to go into town.
- All campers must report back to camp by 4:00pm.
- Only CITs (finished 10th grade) are allowed to stay out until 10:30pm.

Food

While sending food to camp is not allowed, we realize that when out of camp, you and your son may want to return with some goodies! Please refrain from buying large food quantities. We ask that you buy no more than what can be consumed in one-day by a camper. All food will be taken away, and donated, after one day. Stock piling goodies in camper cabins encourages raccoons, squirrels, mice, and ants, to enter cabins in search of these mouthwatering snacks. Please refrain from offering an invitation to these inhabitants of the forest.
